# Annotations to Completed Sample Form 106

## Debtor's Declaration (Official Form 106Dec)

91. After the schedules have been prepared, reviewed by the debtor, and any final corrections made, the debtor must sign the declaration page (Official Form 106Dec). The debtor should be advised that she is declaring under penalty of perjury that she has read the summary and schedules and that the information contained in them is “true and correct.” As with the petition and any other documents signed by the debtor and filed electronically, local rules in some districts require that the debtor’s attorney maintain a copy of the declaration containing a “wet signature” by the debtor for a specified period of time.
